Description: SUMMER@GUS is seeking a Field Trip Activity Counselor who will be responsible for the care of children in grades 3 - 8th grade. Field Trip Activity Counselors are responsible for the daily health and safety of children, including ensuring a child builds positive and meaningful relationships with others while enjoying camp activities in the GUS Adventure Program.

SUMMER@GUS operates on our 23 acre campus.

Qualifications: We seek caring, high energy, dedicated professionals who enjoy physical activity to chaperone and participate in the GUS Adventure Program. This program brings campers to different, fun locations each day throughout the North Shore and greater surrounding area. The Field Trip Activity Counselor has experience in group management and facilitating play. Field Trips include:

- Hiking
- Canoeing
- Beach
- Theatre Performances
- Museums

We seek individuals who have the ability to work in a diverse environment, lead guided discovery, and deliver programming that supports the development of strong character, confidence, creativity, and a sense of community in children 3.5 to 13 years of age.

Specialist staff must be at least 19 years of age and have experience working with children in a structured group setting. Current college students, coaches, paraprofessionals, teaching assistants, school administrators, etc. are encouraged to apply.

Compensation: Starting rate of \$19 per hour, depending on experience.

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Staff must commit to working at least 5 full weeks to SUMMER@GUS, a full 7 week commitment is highly encouraged.
- Staff must commit to attending two weekly staff meetings on Monday and Wednesday at 8:00 a.m.
- Day Camp staff must attend a comprehensive staff orientation before camp begins to embrace the SUMMER@GUS core program and values and build a cohesive staff team who work in the best interest of the campers at all times. Orientation includes health and safety protocols, risk management, behavior management, intentional program design, emergency procedures, use of resources, care of equipment, and overall knowledge of camp procedures.
- A background check, including a Massachusetts CORI, SORI, National Sex Offender Public Registry, and fingerprinting, is required.
- Model appropriate behavior and leadership for children at all times.
- Maintain high standards of health and safety in all activities for children and staff.
- Foster a community with a shared vision that leads to program participant retention.
